Gentlemen,

I have not yet received a reply from the Inspection Division to my letter of February 26, 2025. This letter updates and expands on that letter.

On March 27, 2025, I filed 3 Petitions for Writ of Mandate (“PWOM”) seeking records the City of San Diego (“CITY”) has been withholding; because they know any honest answer and/or evidence they give me will prove the fraud that exists in adult-use cannabis licensing and regulation (“adult-use”) within the CITY. There is reason to believe that other cities in California and in other states where adult-use has been enacted, (in direct contradiction of Section 903 of the Controlled Substances Act, which addresses, “positive conflict” between State and Federal regulation unambiguously.

What makes these 3 PWOMs particularly noteworthy is that they go to the core issues the Democratic party relied on to convince the voters in California, that adult-use, as an all-cash business, needed to be implemented in the state, despite the fact that cannabis remains federally illegal under the Controlled Substances Act (“CSA”).
