SEARCH WARRANT

No. 51510

The People of the State of California, to any peace officer in the County of San Diego:

Proof, by affidavit, having been this day made before my by Detective Marisela Cooper, a peace officer employed by the San Diego Police Department, that there is substantial probable cause pursuant to Penal Code section 1524 for the issuance of the search warrant, as set forth in the affidavit attached hereto and made a part hereof as is fully set forth herein, you are, therefore, commanded to make search at any time of the day, good cause being shown therefore,

LOCATION, PROPERTY, AND/OR PERSON[S] TO BE SEARCHED

A. The premises and all parts therein, including all rooms, attics, basements, cellars, crawl spaces, safes, mail receptacles, storage areas, containers, grounds, trash areas, garages and outbuildings assigned to or part of the business located at **6176-6184 Federal Boulevard., City of San Diego, County of San Diego;** the location is described in the County Assessor System as a single parcel number **#543-020-02-00**. The property is contained by a chain link fence on the northern, western, and eastern borders. The building described as "6176" is a one story tan building with brown trim, and displays the numbers "6176" affixed in black lettering on the front southern face of the building. The numbers are directly west of a solid white steel security door. There is a large wooden sign stating "Fleet Systems" placed directly on the roof above the building. The sign has an illustration depicting an eagle holding an electrical current in its claws. The sign faces south towards the street. The building described as "6184" is a one story tan building with the numbers "6184" clearly affixed to the southern portion of the building in black lettering. The two buildings are separated by a chain link fence and are located in the same land parcel. There is a gate on the fence that provides access to both buildings.

1 B. And for the person known as "Darryl Cotton", a White male adult having a
2 date of birth of 05-29-1960, being about 5'06" in height and 240 lbs. in weight,
3 with a California Driver's License of C1335591;

4 C. And for any vehicles including all vehicle compartments, containers and trunks
5 identifiable as being registered to or belonging to person(s) conducting business
6 at **6176-6184 Federal Boulevard** via keys, admissions and documentation;

7 **ITEMS TO BE SEIZED**

8 For the following property, to wit:

- 9 1. Marijuana, including baggies of marijuana, marijuana cigarettes, loose marijuana,
10 marijuana plants, marijuana derivatives, marijuana seeds, residue described as
11 "honey oil", glass, or metal bowls, butane cylinders, items used in cultivation, sale
12 and use of marijuana, including scales, and other weighing devices, plastic baggies,
13 marijuana paraphernalia;
- 14 2. Paraphernalia for the use, sale and transfer of sale and use of marijuana, including
15 scales, and other weighing devices, plastic baggies, wrapping, bottles, mason jars,
16 extraction tubes, vacuum devices, razor blades, mirrors, and scales;
- 17 3. Evidence of the transfer and sales of marijuana including scales and other weighing
18 devices, articles of personal property tending to establish and document sales of
19 marijuana, including United States currency, gold, precious metals, jewelry, works of
20 art, precious collectible items such as stamps, trading cards, coins, celebrity
21 autographs, and financial instruments including stocks and bonds which are the
22 fruits, instrumentalities and/or evidence of controlled substance trafficking, buyer
23 lists, seller lists, recordation of sales, address and telephone lists;
- 24 4. Other documentation reflecting the receipt or sales of controlled substance including
25 to seize, view, and forensically examine all computers, computer hard drives, discs,
26 "zip" drives, hand held computers commonly referred to as "palm pilots" and cell
27 phones;

- 5. Firearms and ammunition;
- 6. And papers, documents and effects tending to show dominion and control over said premises, including keys, fingerprints, clothing, handwritings, prescription bottles, photographs, documents and effects bearing a form of identification such as a person's name, photograph, Social Security number or driver's license number; and to intercept incoming phone calls both land line and cellular during execution of the warrant;

and if you find the same, or any part thereof, to bring it forthwith before me at the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of San Diego, or to any other court in which the offense in respect to which the property or things is triable, or retain such property in your custody, subject to the order of this Court, pursuant to section 1536 of the Penal Code unless seized under federal asset forfeiture laws pursuant to Title 21 United States Code section 881 and to dispose of said property pursuant to law when the property is no longer of evidentiary value.
