Mr. Cotton repeatedly requested that the City cancel the 6176 CUP application as he is the owner-of-record in accordance with SCMC Section 113.0103. As noted in the CUP application form DS-3032, the "property owner" has "the right to cancel the approval" of the CUP application. During the deposition of Ms. Tirandazi, she was asked why she did not cancel the CUP application at Mr. Cotton's request when confronted with the clear language of SCMC Section 113.0103 in form DS-3032, to which she responded: "I can't speak to that. That's not how we have interpreted that. It's whoever that has been given the right to process the application on behalf of the property owner." Tirandazi Deposition at 33:11-14. Later, she was asked: "So the owner cannot stop the application without the applicant's approval; is that correct?" Ms. Tirandazi replied with: "Well, it wasn't the owner that submitted the application. It was the owner that authorized the application to be submitted on his behalf. So the applicant then would have to request to withdraw the application." Ms. Tirandazi's decision has no basis in law as the regulation was clear: the applicant has the right to cancel the CUP application "in addition to the property owner" as set forth in Form DS-3032. Thus, Mr. Cotton actions taken in seeking to cancel the 6176 CUP application are based on his right as the owner-of-record of the property and granted to him by SCMC Section 113.0103 and stated in form DS-3032.

It is Mr. Cotton's belief that Mr. Bartell used his political influence to delay the 6176 CUP application and to have the 6220 CUP application expedited so that it would get approved based on (i) the fact that the 6176 CUP application was under review over 2 years and never approved and the 6220 CUP application was approved in approximately six months; (ii) Ms. Young's comments regarding Mr. Bartell's comments to have the 6176 CUP application denied; (iii) the communications between Mr. Schweitzer and Mr. Bartell regarding the soils analysis; (iv) the fact that Mr. Schweitzer's employee and company were noted as working for the 6220 CUP application on the City's website and Mr. Schweitzer's claims he does not know how that happened; (v) Mr. Bartell is an expert in the marijuana permitting and licensing process, he testified he spoke with Mr. Weinstein about the case before his deposition, but at his deposition, he claimed to not know if it was unlawful for him to lobby for Mr. Geraci who is prohibited from owning an interest in a marijuana related permit; (vi) his change in testimony that Mrs. Gina Austin was not at the meeting when all the evidence points to concerted efforts by all parties to keep Mrs. Austin out of this litigation; including Mr. Weinstein's emails that Mrs. Austin factual representations to Judge Wohlfeil that the November Document is a sales contract is "legal argument" that cannot be the basis of perpetuating a fraud upon the court when it is determined that the November Document is a receipt and not a sales agreement as she told Judge Wohlfeil.

Please state the date of the conversation and substance of each conversation you have had with Bianca Miller related in any way to Jim Bartell, Larry Geraci, the 6176 CUP APPLICATION, or the 6220 CUP APPLICATION.

RESPONSE TO SPECIAL INTERROGATORY NO. 74:

Provided in response to the request for document production are Facebook messages between Cotton and Martinez that cover the majority of topics regarding Bartell, Geraci and the CUP applications. Issues not covered, but that would have been discussed during the same time frame as the Facebook messages are:

- 1. Geraci has defrauded numerous business partners and, in at least once instance, his business partner committed suicide because the individual was left destitute.
- 2. Bartell sexually harassed Martinez and she started some type of action against him, but was persuaded to drop the action because Bartell is too powerful politically and she would not be able to work as a political lobbyist in San Diego if she maintained that action.
- 3. Geraci and Bartell promised Martinez a 10 % equity position in the CUP at the Property as a finders fee.
