ORDER

(January 22, 2021)

For the reasons set forth in the accompanying Memorandum Opinion, the Court **DENIES** Defendants' Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings. *See* ECF No. 18. In turn, the Court **GRANTS** Mr. Price's Cross-Motion for Judgment on the Pleadings. *See* ECF No. 25.

The Court hereby **DECLARES**, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2201, that the requirements in 54 U.S.C. § 100905, 43 C.F.R. Part 5, and 36 C.F.R. § 5.5 that those engaged in "commercial filming" must obtain permits and pay fees are unconstitutional under the First Amendment. Furthermore, the Court hereby **ENTERS** a permanent injunction enjoining the permit and fee requirements for "commercial filming" in 54 U.S.C. § 100905, 43 C.F.R. Part 5, and 36 C.F.R. § 5.5, and enjoining prosecution and the imposition of criminal liability thereunder. This is a final and appealable order.
