DECLARATION OF ANDREW HALL

I, Andrew Hall, hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am an attorney duly licensed in California and am an attorney at the Blake Law Firm ("BLF"), attorneys of record for Defendant STEPHEN LAKE ("Defendant" or "LAKE"). I am over the age of 18 and the following facts are of my own knowledge, except as to those matters herein stated to be upon information and belief, and as to those facts I am informed and believe them to be true. If called as a witness, I could and would testify competently to the statements in this declaration.
- 2. I have personally worked on books, records and files, and as to the following facts, I know them to be true of my own knowledge, or I have gained knowledge of them from the business records of BLF, all of which were made at or about the time of the events recorded, and which are maintained in the ordinary course of business at or near the time of the acts, conditions or events to which they relate. Any such document was prepared in the ordinary course of business of BLF by a person who had personal knowledge of the event being recorded and had or has a business duty to record accurately those events. The business records are available for inspection and copies can be submitted to the Court if required. If called as a witness, I could and would testify competently thereto.
- 3. On July 26, 2022, LAKE served Requests for Production of Documents, Set One ("RFD") and Form Interrogatories, Set One ("FI") on Plaintiff AMY SHERLOCK ("Plaintiff" or "SHERLOCK") (FI and RFD shall hereinafter be collectively referred to as "Discovery"). Attached hereto and incorporated by reference as **Exhibit 2** is a true and correct copy of the FI served on SHERLOCK. - 4. On August 2, 2022, I received an email from Andrew Flores, counsel for SHERLOCK, agreeing to accept service by email. The mail came from andrew@floreslegal.pro, which is the email address at which the Discovery was served. Attached hereto and incorporated by reference as **Exhibit** 4 is a true and correct copy of the email agreeing to accept service by email.

- 5. On August 15, 2022, Mr. Flores requested an extension of time to respond to the Discovery to November 21, 2022, which I provided. Attached hereto and incorporated by reference as **Exhibit 5** is a true and correct copy of the email from Mr. Flores confirming the November 21, 2022 deadline to respond to the Discovery.
- 6. On October 27, 2022, Mr. Flores appeared *ex parte* to request a stay of the case pending the outcome of a pending appeal of a party unrelated to this motion. I was present at the hearing The Court denied the request and confirmed that there was no stay, including a stay on discovery, in place in the action.

- 8. I never received a response to my October 27, 2022 email. In fact, I have had no further communication with Mr. Flores regarding discovery since my October 27, 2022 email.

- 10. My customary hourly rate is \$450/hr. I spent 4 hours preparing this motion and anticipate spending another 2 hours drafting a reply to any opposition and attending the hearing on this motion for a total of 5 hours or \$2,700. Further, I anticipate that LAKE will incur a \$60 filing fee for this Motion and another \$60 filing fee for the filing of a reply brief for total costs of \$120.
